Job description:

Kiuna is looking for candidates to fill the following positions:

Science – First Nations and Inuit Profile program, which combines the general training offered at Kiuna with specific training in science fields according to the specifications of the Department of Higher Education, is under development. With this in mind, Kiuna is looking for teachers to develop the following course content:

General Chemistry 202-SN1-RE, Chemistry of Solutions 202-SN2-RE and Organic Chemistry 202-SNU-RE Programming in science 420-SN1-RE.

The content specialists are required to take part in start-up and consultation meetings. They will advise the teaching team on the purchase of laboratory equipment and reference books. They will work with other science teachers to establish a program approach oriented towards the enhancement of First Nations and Inuit knowledge. If they so wish, candidates may subsequently teach in their discipline, following Kiuna's selection process.

Requirements:

- Hold a bachelor's degree in the discipline or an appropriate discipline.
- Fluency in spoken and written French and English is an asset.
- Good knowledge of the specific characteristics of education in First Nations communities.

Conditions:

It's possible to combine several mandates. Teaching loads are exclusively on-site based to help our students succeed.
